



YOUR SAFETY

FIRE PREVENTION

DO NOT leave open fires, log burning stoves or Gas Fires unattended at any time.

DO NOT drape any object over a fire or leave directly in front of a fire.

DO NOT burn rubbish or place foreign objects into a fire.

DO NOT under any circumstances empty new or old fire embers into a receptacle inside your holiday home.

DO NOT leave kitchen appliances running whilst away from the property or whilst sleeping.

We advise that you switch off all portable appliances at the mains wall socket when not in use.

Keep doors closed at night in order to minimise the risk of fire spreading.

IN THE EVENT OF A FIRE:

- Remain Calm
- Leave immediately, do not collect your belongings.
- Ensure the room is empty upon leaving and shut the door behind you
- Quickly evacuate the building using the nearest emergency exit.
- Wait at the designated Assembly Point. This location is detailed on the Fire Action Sign fitted to the wall in the property.
- Call 999 for the Fire Brigade or if you do not have a phone signal raise the Alarm at the nearest neighbouring property. Once you have raised the alarm return to the Assembly Point and wait for the Fire Brigade.
- Do not re-enter the building until notified to do so by the Fire Brigade

FIRE SAFETY

Your holiday home is equipped with Smoke Detectors, Heat Detectors and Carbon Monoxide Detectors where required.

These are designed to sound in the event of the presence of Smoke, Fire or Carbon Monoxide fumes.

- Please familiarise yourself with the location of these detectors.
- Please note that many detectors are equipped with batteries - for peace of mind please feel free to test these by depressing the 'test button'.
- When pressing the 'test button' detectors should emit a high pitched beeping sound. If they do not sound when the button is pressed or if an alarm is sounding intermittently for lengthy periods please inform your property manager.

Your holiday home may be located in a rural area and mobile phone signals may be poor. Please familiarise yourself with surrounding properties such as neighbours, the local pub or hotel etc. You may need to call upon these to raise an alarm.

A FIRE ACTION SIGN is fitted to the wall in a prominent place. This provides you with important information on what to do in the event of Fire. Please familiarise yourself with this notice and inform all fellow guests of the emergency procedure.

FINALLY ...

Keep all escape routes clear, make sure all guests can easily open doors on the escape route and final exit in the event of an emergency. Remember these are new surroundings and you are likely to be disorientated, particularly if woken abruptly in the middle of the night. Please familiarise yourself and fellow guests with the layout of your holiday home and the various fire precautions in place for your protection.
